Stage Set for CMDRA 2020 Season Finals

Weather continued to hamper the 2020 Canadian Motorcycle Drag Racing Association season with the August 8 and 9 event at Prince George, BC's Nitro Motorsports Park joining the list of races that shortened by rain. While the Harley-Davidson of Prince George sponsored race was not completed on the designated weekend, CMDRA racers were able to compete for the cash and trophies from Prince George three weeks later on August 29 and 30 during the scheduled round at Edmonton's Castrol Raceway.

The Edmonton round also saw Merritt BC's Matt Mackay-Smith pick up another win to wrap up a successful defense of his MTMM Pro Modified title with one race to spare, while Fort Saskatchewan's Doug Casson defeated reigning champion Quinn Olson in Welch Motorcycles Pro Dragster to extend his lead in the season standings to 100 points coming into the Season Finals in Medicine Hat on September 12 and 13.

Another racer making moves in Edmonton was Calgary's Adam Hettler who picked up wins in both the Superbike class as well as the Southland Powersports Street class. These wins leave Hettler with a 58-point advantage in the season standings in the Street class as well as a narrow 8-point margin in the Superbike class over multi-time champion Riley Toth.

With the points standings in multiple classes leaving the 2020 championships to be decided at the Season Finals in Medicine Hat, AB on September 12 and 13, the final race of the 2020 season promises to be a weekend to remember.
